

GET OUT THE VOTE

in Oklahoma

Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2024, only 64% of the voting-age population in the United States reported voting.

Modern technology has improved access to information on candidates and made it easier to register to vote in many areas, and it is vital to be aware of how you can participate in the 2026 election cycle.

PRIMARY ELECTION TYPE:

Partially Closed

State law allows parties to determine whether unaffiliated voters may participate in the nomination contests before each election cycle. In this type of system, parties may let in unaffiliated voters, while still excluding members of opposing parties.



ABSENTEE AND MAIL-IN VOTING PROCEDURES

Permanent absentee/ mail-in voting procedures:

- No excuse required to request an absentee ballot
- Applications can be submitted by mail, in-person, email, fax, online

DEADLINES TO KNOW FOR VOTING IN

Oklahoma



VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE:

May 22

25 days before the election.

ABSENTEE / MAIL-IN VOTING BALLOT DEADLINES:

Request must be received by

June 1

15 days before the election at 5 PM.

BALLOT SUBMISSION DEADLINE:

Mail receipt by Election Day

Must be received by 7 PM on Election Day.

Absentee ballots that are hand-delivered to the county election board must be delivered no later than the end of business hours on the day before Election Day.
